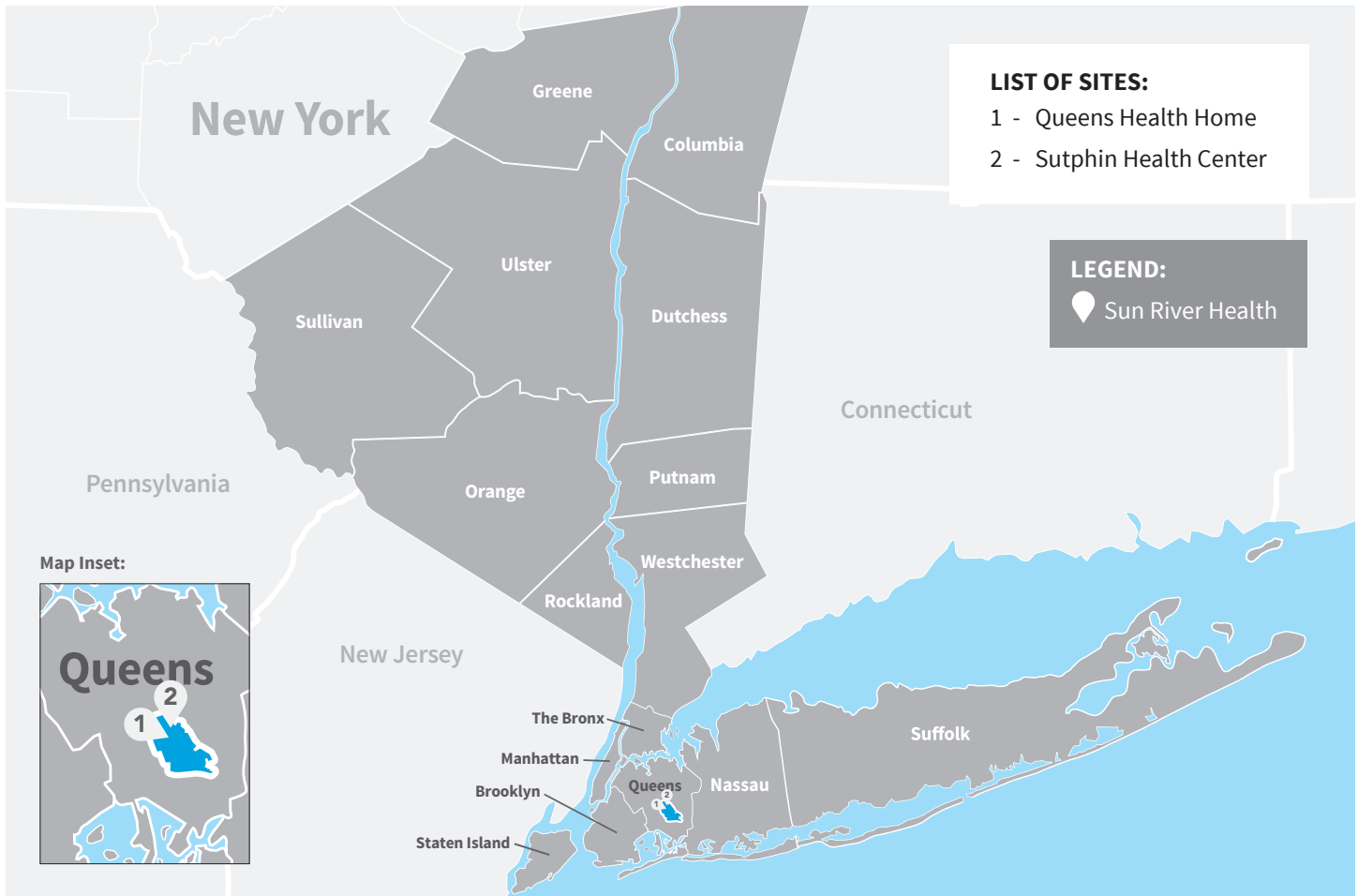

- Our **340B program** provides patients with critical medications at low-to-no cost, including HIV medications and Suboxone
- Patients benefit from the ease of utilizing our **in-house pharmacy**
- We operate an expanded **Adult Day Health Care** program
- Our successful **TransHealth advocacy and support program** offers education and pre/post operative support for transgender individuals
- The Transitional Care Program funded by the Robin Hood foundation, provides **community-based engagement for high-risk patients with HIV, diabetes, or hypertension**

About the Health Home program

- Sun River Health operates the largest Medicaid Health Home in New York State, serving **over 18,000 Medicaid members**, children and adults, with serious mental illness and other chronic conditions. By engaging and stabilizing the highest need Medicaid members, our network **creates cost-savings** for NYS and healthcare payers, while teaching patients to **effectively manage their own care**, and connecting them to appropriate supportive services that address their complex situations. Since 2015, our Health Home program has decreased mental health hospitalization by **3% per year**, decreased substance use hospitalization by **8% per year**.

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
