Breaking Down Barriers to Health Care: The Patient Assistance Fund

Providing Vital Support

Did you know Sun River Health is the largest provider of Obstetrics services of all the Federally **Qualified Health Centers in New York State?**

Each year, our obstetrics staff, in collaboration with partner hospitals throughout the state, welcome over 3,500 babies into the world. And, thanks to funding from the State of New York, we provide family planning services to more than 20,000 patients in our health centers.

Caring for new and expectant moms involves everyone on our Women's Health team - from physicians, midwives, and nurse practitioners to patient navigators, social workers, and nutritionists. These dedicated professionals work together to ensure our moms are healthy, educated, and prepared to deliver and care for their new babies.

To that end, the team has developed a warm and welcoming suite of items to help guide and encourage our new and expectant moms, including: a bodysuit, pacifier clip, hat, and baby blanket, along with a folder of valuable information to help our new moms become confident caregivers for their new babies and return to the trusted care Sun River Health Pediatrics provides. Our Developmental Milestones material, available in both English and Spanish, is specially designed to support clinicians' conversations with women who are expecting or have just delivered. It also lays the foundation for understanding the need for

clinical support after the child is born, and throughout early childhood.

We had an enthusiastic response to a special appeal for our Women's Health Initiative. Thanks to the generosity of donors like you, we were able to purchase and distribute 400 gift baskets to new moms last year in addition to supporting our broader Women's Health programs. We are grateful for donor support of these initiatives, which help new moms feel appreciated and more confident in caring for their babies. You can help change lives with your support.

Back-to-school preparation took a delightful turn for some lucky area children this fall thanks to Blackstone Inc. The program, now in its third year, has grown immensely, and we are so grateful for help ensuring that these boys and girls have what they need to feel confident at school. Healthier Communities Start at the Local Level

Every August, the National Association of Community Health Centers celebrates America's 1,400 Community Health Centers (CHCs). This year's theme, "The Roadmap to a Stronger America," underscored the important role CHCs like Sun River Health play in providing quality, comprehensive health care services to more than 30 million patients across 14,500 communities annually.

Since 1975, Sun River Health has been a part of communities throughout the Hudson Valley, New York City, and Suffolk County, and we are proud to provide high-quality care, improve health outcomes, and narrow health disparities in these neighborhoods.

To celebrate and raise awareness of our services, we hosted three community events in Peekskill, The Bronx, and Patchogue. The events featured live music, bounce houses, vaccination offerings and screenings, petting zoos, food trucks, back-to-school backpacks, free books for children, information and resources for support services, and so much more. Events like these are a reminder of the holistic approach we take, stepping outside the clinic, to address the social determinants of health – and help community members gain access to healthcare.

We are always very excited to see so many community members come out in support of the festivities. We are grateful for our staff, patients, elected officials, partners, supporters, and donors for helping Sun River Health host three wonderful and successful events to benefit our community.

Meet Our Immunization Champion! Honoring Extraordinary Care: Rasheed Ali, RN

Congratulations to Rasheed Ali, RN, Nurse Manager for our vaccine programs, who received the CDC's 2023 Immunization Champion Award for New York! Rasheed was selected out of 25 nominations submitted, including applications submitted for CEOs, Physicians, Nurses, and Program Directors. The award recognizes individuals who are doing an exemplary job or going above and beyond to promote or foster immunizations in their communities.

Rasheed aided in the implementation of Sun River Health's COVID-19 vaccination strategies to ensure public safety. Along with promoting community outreach and engagement, his program incorporates education, counseling, vaccinations, and related health care services for those in need.

> Commitment to Sustainability This newsletter was printed regionally at a family-owned and operated plant, which adheres to environmentally sustainable manufacturing practices. These include participation in one of the largest community solar projects in New York State, a closed-loop paper-recycling agreement with their largest supplier, and use of soy inks. All paper used at the press has a minimum of at least 20% recycled pulp. In addition, 70% of all short-run production uses a digital format which requires 90% less startup waste.
